Pat Conroy Lifetime Achievement Award Sponsored by Leslie & Landon Thorne


Cary Sinise's stage, television and film career has spanned nearly fifty years. Beginning in 1974, he co-founded Chicago's Steppenwolf Theatre Company then twenty years later for his performance as Lt. Dan Taylor in the blockbuster film Forrest Gump, he received nominations for Golden Globe, Screen Actors Guild (SAG) and Academy Awards, and earned Best Supporting Actor Award from the National Board of Review and the Commander's Award from the Disabled American Veterans. Other film credits include Apollo 12, Ransom, The Green Mile and The Human Stain.

His most recent film and television work include, I Still Believe, Good Joe Bell and 13 Reasons Why. Sinise is an Emmy, Golden Globe, and two-time SAG Award winner for his in Truman and George Wallace. Gary also starred in the CBS television series Criminal Minds: Beyond Borders and CSI: $N\gamma$

In 2003, after several USO handshake tours, he formed the Lt. Dan



Band and began entertaining troops serving at home and abroad. Over the years, the 13 piece cover band has performed hundreds of shows for charities and fundraisers supporting wounded heroes, Gold Star families, veterans and troops around the world. In 2011 he established the Gary Sinise Foundation with the mission to serve and honor America's defenders, veterans, first responders, Gold Star families and those in need.







inda Lee, current president of the Carolina Film Alliance, began working in the film and television industry in the 70's in New Orleans, where she learned the business by working in every department that would take her. Eventually, she formed her own production company and produced directed local commercials. while still coordinating and location managing the big national commercials.

In 1976, Linda was hired to work with the Art Director of a Saturday Night Live Mardi Gras Special. The following year she moved to New York to work on the show's parody commercials.

Linda moved back to Charleston in 1989, just in time for South Carolina's best years of film production. This began a long working relationship as a scout for the South Carolina Film Commission which led to Location Managing 6 feature films, 2 M.O.W, a documentary series, and numerous commercials throughout the 90's, culminating in *The Patriot*.

Linda's more recent work includes scouting for Reckless, Identity, South of Hell, Vice Principals, The Sinner, Halloween, and OBX.



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

"At Capacity" Screenings and Events Ticket Policy

The Beaufort International Film Festival has limited seating capacity and strives to accommodate as many patrons as possible. Therefore, before the start of each "At Capacity" film block the venue will be completely cleared. There will be no saving seats or leaving ANY personal belongings behind. If you have some type of medical exception, you will need to discuss it with a BIFF representative immediately. A Standby line for those individuals who wish to TRY to purchase a ticket to an "At Capacity" film block will begin forming one hour before the start of any "At Capacity" film block showing to attempt to fill every seat possible. Fifteen minutes prior to the start of every "At Capacity" film block, BIFF will sell any empty seats to patrons who are present. There are no guarantees that seats will be available. Therefore, we suggest all ticket holders arrive at the festival venue 45 minutes in advance of the "At Capacity" film block to ensure that they are in their seats at least 15 minutes prior to the start of the "At Capacity" film block. If you have purchased a ticket and are turned away due to seats being filled prior to your arrival, BIFF will refund the price of the BLOCK TICKET or will exchange it for another ticket of equal value.

Late seating is not permitted once the film block has started.

Lines will be formed in the lobby by ticket type and we will utilize the hallways of the venue to hold patrons before the doors are opened to auditorium. If possible, seating will begin 45 minutes prior to the start of the film block and will be taken in the following order:

- Filmmakers associated with the "At Capacity" film and wearing the assigned credentials and any of their ticketed guests will have seating priority
- VIP BIFF Sponsors wearing the Green and Gold ticket lanyards
- BIFF Sponsors wearing the Jean Ribaut ticket lanyards
- All Events ticket holders
- Visiting Filmmakers wearing the blue and gold lanyards that are watching and supporting the "At Capacity" film block
- Day Passes






